- a. Describe how the money will be spent (i.e., \$X for salaries; \$X for programming; \$X for equipment; etc.). Provide as many details as possible. Are there other funds for the project (from the City or an outside source) and where is it coming from?
- 6. Why the project is a good use of taxpayer funds?

### 7. Partners and Supporters

a. Create a comprehensive list of entities that may provide a letter of support. The more support you have, the more likely it is that your project is submitted by the federal elected official. Look at other elected officials (state senators/assemblymembers, county supervisor, neighboring cities, police/fire chiefs) as well as community leaders (school superintendent, nonprofits, hospital leaders).
